


PLANNING SECTION CRITICAL TASKS

- Maintain situational awareness by collecting and managing relevant operational data.
- Process and prioritize data into intelligence.
- Manage the preparation of the incident action plan.
- Provide feedback to the Incident Commander and Operations Section Chief to support operational decision making.

The job of the Planning Section is to verify, synthesize, and communicate a clear picture to the organization/ decision makers!



EOC PLANNING SECTION - TASK ORGANIZATION












